Director: Ambassador Robert T. Grey, Jr., former U.S. Representative to the Conference on Disarmament, was also Leader of the State Department UN Reform Team. Ambassador Grey was a Senior Fellow on the Council on Foreign Relations and Counselor for Political Affairs of the United States Mission to the United Nations in New York. Ambassador Grey also served as Acting Deputy Director of the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency as well as Counselor for Political Affairs, U.S. Mission to NATO in Brussels. Chair: Ambassador Thomas Graham, Jr., a senior U.S. diplomat, was involved in the negotiation of every major international arms control and nonproliferation agreement of the past 30 years. As President Clinton's Special Representative for Arms Control, Non-proliferation and Disarmament, he led the successful U.S. government effort to indefinitely extend the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. He is currently the Chairman of the Cypress Fund for Peace and Security.



Gloria Duffy served as U.S. Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense and Special Coordinator for Cooperative Threat Reduction in the Clinton administration. She is currently President and CEO of The Commonwealth Club of California, the nation's largest and oldest public affairs forum. Dr. Duffy also serves as Chair of the Board of the U.S. Civilian Research and Development Foundation. She is the author/editor of two books, *International Arms Control Issues and Agreements* (Stanford University Press, 1983) and *Compliance and the Future of Arms Control* (Ballinger, 1987) and many articles in scholarly journals and the popular press. In prior years, Dr. Duffy served as the first Executive Director of Ploughshares Fund, Assistant Director of the Arms Control Association, editor of *Arms Control Today*, and as a resident consultant at the RAND Corporation.



Ambassador James Goodby, former Ambassador to Finland, served as Vice Chairman of the U.S. Delegation to the Strategic Nuclear Arms Negotiations with the U.S.S.R. Ambassador Goodby also served as Chief of the U.S. Delegation to the Conference on Disarmament, and Chief U.S. Negotiator for the Safe and Secure Dismantlement of Nuclear Weapons. In addition, he was Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Politico-Military Affairs and Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European Affairs. Ambassador Goodby is currently a Senior Research Fellow, M.I.T. and Senior Fellow, (nonresident), The Brookings Institution. He has taught at Carnegie Mellon, Stanford and Georgetown and is the author of *Europe Undivided*, a book on U.S.-Russian relations.



Rose Gottemoeller is Director of Carnegie Moscow Center. Formerly, Gottemoeller served as a senior associate at the Carnegie Endowment, where she held a joint appointment with the Russian and Eurasian Program and the Global Policy Program. In addition Ms. Gottemoeller served as Deputy Undersecretary for Defense and Nuclear Nonproliferation in the U.S. Department of Energy and Deputy Director of the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London. From 1993 to 1994, she served on the National Security Council in the White House as director for Russia, Ukraine, and Eurasia Affairs . Jonathan Granoff is President of the Global Security Institute, is also Senior Advisor of the American Bar Association's Committee on Arms Control and National Security. He is Vice President of the NGO Committee on Disarmament at the UN, and serves on numerous governing and advisory boards including the Lawyers Committee on Nuclear Policy, the Lawyers Alliance for World Security, the Jane Goodall Institute, the Bipartisan Security Group, and the Middle Powers Initiative. Mr. Granoff has lectured worldwide emphasizing the legal, ethical and spiritual dimensions of human development and security, with a specific focus on the threats posed by nuclear weapons. He is an award-winning screenwriter, and has been featured in more than 30 publications. He has practiced law in Philadelphia as an individual practitioner, in several medium sized firms, and as in-house counsel in a public company. He chaired the special session on Terrorism and Threats to Humanity at the Summit of Nobel Peace Laureates in Rome in 2004 where he represented the International Peace Bureau, a Nobel Peace Laureate organization.



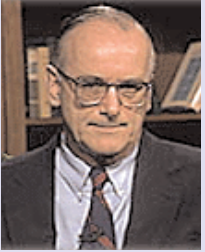

Barry Kellman is Professor of International Law at DePaul University College of Law and Co-Director of the International Criminal Justice and Weapons Control Center. He has been a consultant to the U.S. Department of Defense Special Weapons Agency, the Organization for the Prevention of Chemical Weapons, the U.S. Department of Energy, and the U.S. Department of Commerce. Mr. Kellman has published many books and articles on legal issues relevant to controlling biological weapons.



Professor David Koplow, former Deputy General Counsel of the Department of Defense, teaches International Law and National Security, Arms Control and Non-proliferation at Georgetown University. Prof. Koplow also served as special assistant to the Director of the U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency and Secretary of the Lawyers Alliance for World Security.



John Rhineland is Senior Counsel at Shaw Pittman LLP and Vice Chairman of the Lawyers Alliance for World Security (LAWS). He previously served in six departments and agencies of the federal government, including as General Counsel of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.



Suzanne Spaulding is a Managing Director at The Harbour Group, LLC. Previously she was Executive Director of the National Commission on Terrorism, and the Commission to Assess the Organization of the Federal Government to Combat the Proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction. She also served as General Counsel of the Senate Intelligence Committee, Assistant General Counsel of the CIA, and Minority Staff Director for the U.S. House of Representatives Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence . Ms. Spaulding also chaired the American Bar Association's Standing Committee on Law and National Security.
