Experts and Celebrities Join to Discuss Non-Proliferation and the Limits of Unilateralism

On Thursday, October 2, Christopher and Congressman Ed Markey, co-chairs of the House Bipartisan Task Force on Non-Proliferation, welcomed Actor Michael Douglas, noted Primatologist Jane Goodall, and Ambassador Thomas Graham for a discussion entitled, "The Limits of Unilateralism." Douglas, Goodall and Reed stressed the importance of nations cooperating with and engaging one another to bring greater global security. Nearly 200 people attended the event.

In his address, Ambassador Graham stated, "America does not need empire, it needs peace, cooperation, and the international rule of law. America should move away from the tendency toward unilateralism and should return to its historic destiny of keeping the peace and fostering the development of the community of nations, democracies, free market economy, the international rule of law, international institutions, and treaty arrangements. This is both consistent with our principles and our national interest. It is in this way that the twin threats of nuclear proliferation and international terrorism will be lifted. And, it is in this way that peace and stability for the 21st century will finally be attained."

The Bipartisan Task Force on Nonproliferation was formed in 1997 by Reps. Markey and Shays to provide a forum for the discussion of nonproliferation issues in the post-Cold War world. The Task Force currently has 34 members.
