WASHINGTON, DC--On Wednesday, June 18, the House of Representatives Bipartisan Task Force on Non-Proliferation will host a Bipartisan Security Group panel for Members of Congress and their staff on the future of arms control treaties.

Panelists will include:

 -John HOLUM, former Undersecretary of State for Arms Control and International Security.

The moderator will be Ambassador Robert Grey, Jr., former U.S. Representative to the Conference on Disarmament in Geneva and Director of the Bipartisan Security Group.
